2010 HIGHLIGHTS WITH LARKSPUR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

LHS has a close working relationship with the elementary school to keep history alive for the children.

LHS dedicated a Larkspur poster and a plaque to Betty Prince at Larkspur Elementary during an all-school assembly in February. Betty was the founder and first president of Larkspur Historical Society.

In September, PENNY BURDICK, DANNA HAMLING, SUE KOLLER and LARRY SCHLUPP conducted the annual second grade tour.

LHS began the tour at the Crull-Hammond cabin, followed by a stop at the Ben Quick property, showcasing the rhyolite and frame houses. The third stop was the one-room Greenland School house which has been restored by Douglas County's Historic Restoration Specialists. The children and parents received a bit of education as to school days of a by-gone era. Following lunch and a hike out of the Greenland Trail Head, the group headed into Larkspur to the home of long-time resident, Mary Garcilaso. Mary's home is a transformed railroad box car.

At the end of the tour day, LARRY presented each second grade student with a piece of rhyolite from the Madge Quarry near Castle Rock. Bars of soap made by DANNA were presented to the second grade winners of the playground game "Hot Potato" at the Greenland School.

TIES WITH LARKSPUR

LHS participated in Larkspur Parks and Recreation's revitalization program by purchasing a tile emblazoned with LHS's logo.

LHS also participated in the Town of Larkspur's annual 4th of July celebration in the Park. LHS was joined by JOHN and SUSAN HULTMAN. JOHN is a collector of antique and antique reproduction firearms and SUSAN demonstrated yarn spinning.


Early in December, LARRY and DANNA, decked-out in Victorian costumes, joined Parks & Recreation in the annual tree lighting event.

CRULL - HAMMOND CABIN

In May, the cabin was opened to the public in celebration of Colorado Archaeology and Historic Preservation Month. LHS dedicated a large kiosk donated to LHS by the Town of Larkspur and that had been placed on the Crull property. By April 2011, the kiosk will feature information on the Town of Huntsville, the Crull/Hammond cabin and other pertinent history of this area. The kiosk information was prepared by DANNA, BILL, the Douglas County Historic Preservation Board, and the Douglas County Community Planning and Sustainable Development.

We also toured Larkspur Heights in the American Federation of Human Rights vicinity. Many of these small homes once belonged to the Federation and were built for the summer denizens, attending programs sponsored by the Federation.

HUNTSVILLE

Huntsville was once a thriving community north of Larkspur before there was a Larkspur. Starting in September, LARRY has undertaken a project of identifying some of the Huntsville sites of note - The People's Fort (aka Fort Lincoln or Oakes Folly), Mrs. Coberly's Hotel, and D. C. Oakes sawmill.

2010 SPRING VALLEY CEMETERY TOUR



In addition to PENNY's site identifying work, she worked tirelessly on documenting and submitting Greenland for Douglas County land-marking and initiated the action to potentially preserve Spring Valley School.
