Walking Tour hosted by the Larkspur Historical Society

Board Member and Docent of the Larkspur Historical Society, Danna Hamling leads this walking tour through Larkspur's interesting and colorful history. A town founded when the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad arrived in 1871, Larkspur flourished in the late nineteenth and early twentieth century. You will learn about Larkspur's commercial, social and fraternal growth with the Frink-Carlson Creamery, its wide-spread reputation as "A dancing town" and the choice by the Co-Masons for its International Headquarters, the American Federation of Human Rights. Larkspur sports two properties on the *Douglas County Landmark Program*, one of which is on the National Register of Historic Places.

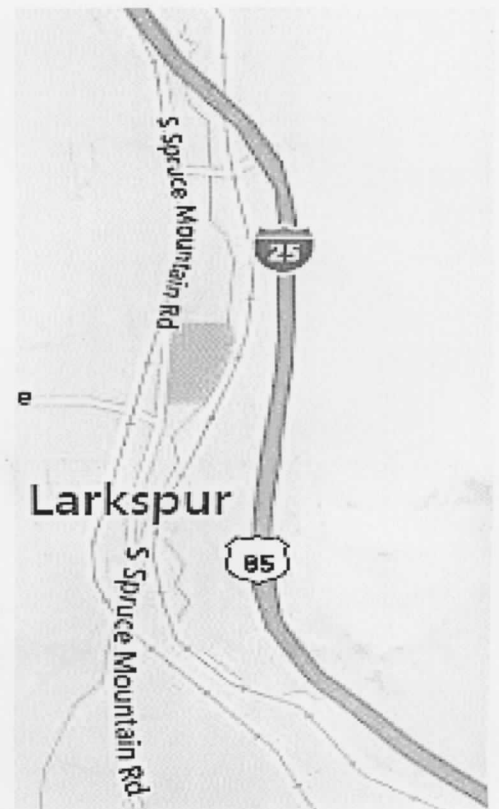
