**\*\*Fairmount Cemetary** will be getting a memorial dedicated to those who died in Colorado of the 1918 flu on June 8, 2019 at 10am. Last death was in June 1919, and many graves were not marked due to the large number of deaths and those ill, which is partially why the memorial is being placed. Add'l info is on this website:

Located in Pueblo, CO with access to all the company and employee archives upon appt.  
-Many smaller museums & archives will have data on 1918 flu if you specifically request the access to their archives. Date range of main pandemic for research in CO is from August 1918 to May 1919.
